Education back on track



International Village School (IVS)

In Kenya, the school calendar is made up of 3 terms starting in January and ending in November each year. Following the outbreak of COVID-19, all schools closed at the end of the first term in March 2020.

Schools reopened on 4 January 2021 to continue with the curriculum of the 2020 second term. The school calendar has therefore been adapted to accommodate this 8.5 month suspension of education for all students and the normal school calendar will only resume as of 2023.

IVS school students' attendance on the first day back to school on 4 January 2021 was good with only 3 students not returning including two Form 2 students (parents and guardians are being contacted) and one Form 4 student who left for another school. We are also still looking for a replacement Maths and Chemistry teacher who left in 2020. We have ensured all social distancing rules are met.

Teachers and final year students in Form 4 are working hard as they have their final school exams (KCSE) in late March 2021.

JumpStart Pre-primary

Jumpstart, our pre-primary class, also opened on 4 January 2021. All students returned and we had to bring in two extra tables to ensure good social distancing. The children will also receive their morning porridge and daily lunch.



Feeding Programs



We hope to also soon recommence our porridge programs, at Kigama and Kakemer primary schools. The programs have been feeding children since 2007 and 2008 respectively, but were also interrupted last year due to COVID-19 pandemic.

Training Centres and Sewing School

We are keeping our two training centres and the sewing school closed whilst we monitor the infection rate of CO-VID-19 in the rural areas and shall review when we can open in February 2021.

In the meantime, we built two new pit latrines (right photo) at the Emuhaya training centre, as after 16 years the old latrines needed to be replaced. Thank you to the donors at the end of 2020, whose donations helped us build these two toilets.

Children's Support Centre



Our Children's Support Centre was open throughout 2020, although only for out-patients from March, with more than 3'000 consultations during the year. Staff in above photo.

We also distributed maize to needy families (left photo) in total over 1'500 food donations were made during 2020.

Due to problems with supplies to government health centres and malaria treatments being unavailable for a large part of the year, CSC provided 475 free malaria treatments after testing (from 670 children and parents tested, 70% were positive).
